

Nevada Volunteers recognizes that understanding the various streams of National Service can be challenging. This chart will help answer questions to determine if National Service may be a fit for your organization.

State Commissions were designed to be in every state to build the **national service public and private partnership** as a 1:1 match between states and the federal government. In Nevada the Commission's federal funds are matched with state, private and in-kind sources.
